THE CHESTER MILLENNIUM FESTIVAL TRAIL REVISITED

Thursday, August 24th 2017, 10.30 am

Bishop Lloyd's Palace

The Chester Millennium Festival Trail was laid down in 2000 as part of the city's '2000 Years of Building' Millennium Festival. The forty pavement plaques are all individual works of art created by Michael Johnson in bronze, stainless steel and glass.

The Festival was a partnership between Chester Civic Trust, Chester City Council, the Cheshire Society of Architects and the University of Chester, while the Trail itself was a joint venture by the Trust and the Council. Buildings were nominated by the public and the cost of the plaques was met by the Heritage Lottery Fund.

Chester Civic Trust has been monitoring the plaques and recently two were replaced. We are especially grateful to Samuel Smiths Brewery for agreeing to pay for the new plaque at The Falcon. Storyhouse will soon be reinstating the plaque outside the former Odeon cinema, and the Council will, when possible, re-open the Inner Bailey of Chester Castle so that the Trail plaque for the Agricola Tower can be seen again. Most of the other plaques remain in remarkably good condition.

We will begin this walk at **Bishop Lloyd's Palace** with tea and coffee at **10.30am**.

Nora Edwards and **Stephen Langtree** will then lead us in exploring the Trail in two different sections. We will meet again at Bishop Lloyd's Palace at about 12.30 p.m. for a final drink and to discuss what we have seen. Children and grandchildren are welcome.

The walk is free of charge, but a donation on the day for tea and coffee would be gratefully received.
